Scholarship Amount:

OAIMA, Ohio Aglime Council, and the Holmes Safety Association – Mid Ohio Council will Award a minimum of \$2,500 to students in 2018. These Scholarships will be awarded at the November 16, 2018 OAIMA Annual Meeting Awards Breakfast, for use in pursuit of their degree.

Eligibility:

Student must be a citizen of the United States. Student must be in good academic standing and agree to take a course relating to the exploration, excavation, engineering, acquisition, production or other areas related to the Industrial Minerals industry in Ohio. Scholarship winners will be required to furnish a transcript. Scholarships will be awarded to students entering or enrolled in an Associate or Bachelor Degree Program in Civil Engineering, Construction Materials or a related field at an Ohio university/college. Graduate students with their major focus of study related to construction materials with an emphasis on mining and attending an Ohio university/college will also be considered.

Selection:

Selection of scholarship recipients will be based upon the following criteria:

1. Application must to be typed or printed clearly.
2. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
3. There should be a demonstrated interest in a career in the Ohio Industrial Minerals Industry.
4. Student's extracurricular and philanthropic activities will be considered.
5. Although it is not a criterion, applicants should indicate if there is a need for financial assistance.
6. Although outstanding scholastic ability is not a criterion, student must be in good academic standing with the university/college.
7. Letters of recommendation are not required but no more than two may be included.
